I. Staff Discussion Items

A. 2022-09 The Next Ten Five-Year Update

Michele McIntosh-Ross, Planning and Zoning Manager, presented the Next Ten Five-Year Update. The Next Ten is the City of Sandy Springs's comprehensive plan that establishes the City's vision for land use, development, and capital improvements. It serves as the official statement of the City's vision looking 20-years into the future and documents corresponding policies and recommendations to guide future decisions. The State of Georgia minimum planning standards requires local governments to update their comprehensive plans every five years, report five-year accomplishments, and re-engage the community to update the projects and recommendations. Information about the Next Ten Five-Year Update will be published on the City's website, including the 2017 Next Ten, so people can learn more about it. Staff will share additional information about the five-year update at the upcoming City Council Retreat.

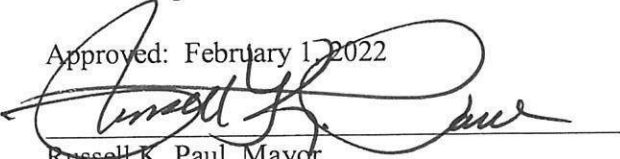
Mayor Rusty Paul stated he will soon make appointments to the citizen advisory committee for the Next Ten Five-Year Update.

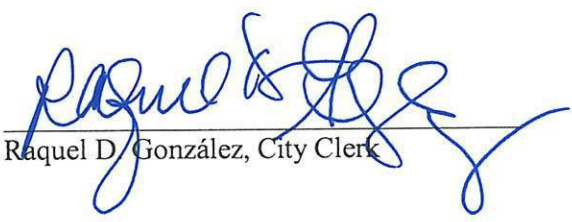
III. City Council Discussion Items
